

Sports Premium

At The Downs Primary school, we pride ourselves on the quality of our P.E. curriculum, the wealth of opportunities given to pupils to participate in competitive sports and games and the wide range of sporting activities offered in lessons and clubs.

In March 2013, the Government determined to pay a 'ring-fenced sport premium' to all primary schools to enable each school to 'improve the quality and breadth of its PE and sporting provision'. The sum received by The Downs Primary School for the academic year 2022-2023 was £20,410. The total spent on Sports during 2022/2023 was £21,126.29.

The 5 key indicators where improvements should be seen are:

- 1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity, aiming for 30 minutes a day within school time.
- 2. The profile of PE and sport is raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

The National Curriculum aims:

- Develop competence to excel in a broad range of physical activities
- Are physically active for sustained periods of time
- Engage in competitive sports and activities
- Lead healthy, active lives.

The table below shows how the allocated funding for 2022-2023 was utilized and the impact expenditure has had on enhancing sporting provision in terms of learning outcomes, engagement, sporting success and pupil well-being.

Key achievements to date until July 2023:

Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

PLATINUM Sports Mark awarded.

Continue and increase participation in Inter-Sports competitions.

21 Inter School Sports competitions entered.

Commence after-school sports clubs.

An annual sports day was held, which involved all the school and was an opportunity for competition for all abilities. We ran it over a number of days day with pupils wearing their house colours. We had Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 house winners.

Continue with Pupil PE Ambassadors in order to give the pupils a voice in the delivery of PE and School Sport.

School's own mini-bus used to provide transport to every competition and swimming sessions. This has helped ensure the children all arrive safely and reduces the issue of transport and parents not being able to

Maintain and replenish PE resources.

Investment in sporting equipment to train for new tournaments.

Increase the use of the minibus, sharing resources with the other primary schools in the trust.

Look at targeting students more efficiently. We are looking at doing this in 2 ways.

- Targeting those who are not participating in sports outside of school.
- Target those who are gifted and talented, pushing them to attend local clubs and creating those links, sporting financially if possible.

Introduced a new way of collecting evidence of subjects taught. PE
Ambassadors will be introduced to the new method of collecting evidence to help support staff. We will be using iPads to capture videos and pictures.

Increase girls' take up of sports.

Continue swimming for Year 5 23/24 to increase number of children who can swim 25m.
