Census Day

On Thursday 18th January, we have our School Census Day.

Each term we are asked to provide data via the School Census. The School Census collects data from primary schools, secondary schools, special schools, maintained nurseries and academies as well as pupil referral unites.

The data is collected to help develop a picture of the education and sector and how well it is performing. It is also needed to provide core funding for schools, this funding includes children who are eligible for Pupil Premium, children in receipt of Universal Free School Meals (Reception to Year 2), provide support for disadvantaged children and free early years entitlement allocations.

We are providing a themed lunch on Thursday 18th January. Each child who takes up a school lunch on Census Day provides funding for the school, therefore we would like to encourage as many children to enjoy one of the options on the menu. (Menu can be found on the next page).

Information about what data items are included in the census is available here.

As you know the Government's Universal Free School Meals initiative means that all children in Reception and Key Stage 1 are entitled to a free meal. However, children in Key Stage 2 (Year 3 to 6) must apply to receive this.

If you are claiming any of the following benefits you may still be able to claim Free School Meals for you child by completing an application at www.essex.gov.uk/free-school-meals

To be eligible you must be receiving one of the following:

- Income Suppoort
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Child Tax Credit (not Working Tac Credit) with an annual income below £16,190
- Pension Guaranteed Credit
- Employment and Support Allowance, income related
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Working Tax Credit run on, paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit, with a household income of £7,400 or less (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

As a school, we can claim extra funding for children who are entitled to Free School Meals. This funding is called Pupil Premium and is used in a variety of ways to support children in their learning. This funding continues to be paid to the school for 6 years (or as long as your child attends the school), even if you stop claiming the above benefits.

Even if your child will be having packed lunches, please still claim Free School Meals if you are entitled to, as this will allow us to access the Pupil Premium funding.

If you don't claim Free School Meals, we cannot claim Pupil Premium. School budgets have been cut for the last few years, so it really is essential that we are able to access this extra funding to support your child.

Census Day

In order for us to claim this additional funding please provide the following details via the online form. This will enable the Local Authority to make an assessment to confirm if our school qualifies to receive this funding for your child.

Voluntary Registration for Pupil Premium

In the past, families in receipt of Free School Meals have received school meal vouchers during the school holidays.

Please note this check will not affect any benefits you are claiming.
